ELLIS L. MATHES SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The Intermountain Section awards two annual \$2,000 scholarships for undergraduate (Junior or above) or graduate students in the Intermountain Section area (Idaho, Montana, Nevada, and Utah) enrolled in curriculum in engineering with an emphasis in Transportation. If a candidate has previously been awarded this scholarship, he/she is not eligible to reapply.

SELECTION COMMITTEE: Officers of the Intermountain Section

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: Application will be no more than three (3) pages including a concise description of the following:

1. Career goals
2. Academic record (attach current transcript – does not account towards page limit)
3. Work experience
4. Financial need
5. Curriculum towards engineering degree with a transportation emphasis
6. Membership activities in Student Chapter of ITE or other group if no chapter exists
7. State of residence
8. Other honors, awards, and scholarships

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION:

1. Career goals
2. Academic record (current transcript)
3. Work experience
4. Financial need
5. Quality of application
6. Additional points or considerations:
 - a. Residency in Intermountain area
 - b. ITE Student Chapter activities or other ITE affiliations
 - c. Gender equity

HISTORY OF THE INTERMOUNTAIN SECTION SCHOLARSHIP

Ellis L. Mathes, P.E., was a pioneer of the Western District (District 6) and the Intermountain Section and remained active in ITE until his death. Even though he had significant physical disabilities, he attended meetings and had a friendly smile. He was typical of traffic engineers in his willingness to encourage young engineers and share his knowledge and ideas with the profession. In memory of his contributions to the traffic engineering profession, the Intermountain Section Scholarship was named in his honor in 1996, and has been awarded to deserving students pursuing studies in transportation engineering with this scholarship at the annual meeting in Jackson, Wyoming.
